Lanterns // lamps

In the Japanese culture the use of Washi (paper) is a century old concept. The extraordinary quality of the material is that it reduces the vibration of light and simultaneously the movement of the eye. Due to the soft and comforting appearance of the light the Japanese describe the use of Washi as “the Moon in the house”.

De facettet shape is derived from the first traditional hexagonal Japanese Lantern's.

Balancing // ergonomic stool

A stool that balances the position of the body. The object is based on the movement of the spine so that the user subconsciously keeps the body moving. By the ongoing movement the stool corrects the posture of the body and keeps the back muscles flexible. The three blocks are an abstraction of a vertebrae and are made of untreated solid yellow popular wood.

TANNIC ACID PLATES | STEVEN BANKEN

Tannic acid is applied in a rotating movement on the steel plate. Different shades of blue become visible by the intensity of tannic acid. The Oak strip is treated on the inside with the rust of steel to join the two materials.

“Plates” is part of the project “Tannic Acid”. The project reveals the exceptional similarity in color of Oak and steel after the natural transition. The reaction between tannic acid and red iron oxide turns the materials into dark blue.

COPPER LAMP | STEVEN BANKEN

Walnut parts fits precisely in the ends of the copper tube. The source of light reflects on the copper and creates a clear light centre surrounded with a warm copper semblance. The different parts are shaped by hand and composed on the same machine, the lathe.

Changes of shape such as tapered legs and curved back of a chair were the starting point of this project. Research in craftsmanship and the possibilities of woodworking machines resulted in a new method.

Wooden parts are partially sawed and glued in a curved shape. The saw cuts stay partially visible as an interstice that accentuates the shape.

Hydrophobia

Uses her work to reveal the things that lie beneath the surface. She turns subjects that are rarely discussed into something tangible, from an awareness in which mankind and nature are paramount. Through in-depth investigation she eventually finds a way to translate her research in a tangible product.

A fascination for the old Japanese Suminagashi technique forms the basis for the experimental methodology where the hydrophobic reaction between water and oil based pigments is used to create a unique graphic pattern. Due to this process of discrepancy a fractal motif arises on the surface of the water. This fluid pattern of liquid tension is captured and fixated on delicate silk and fine ceramics. A fleeting two-dimensional surface transforms into a tangible and solid whole.

Moiré Jewelry

This series of jewelry, is a celebration of the intriguing moiré effect. By moving or rotating the black front layer, the pattern interferes with the background pattern. Rings or dots seem to appear and to move, making this into an almost hypnotic effect. This jewelry invites you to play and become fascinated by the moiré principle.

Bellamp

As a designer I work with used materials and objects, especially metal. To find those I am seen a lot at the scrapheap. While I was on one of my visits there I found a couple of discarded air tanks which I took to my studio. While transporting the tanks, once in a while a wonderful sound emerged from the tanks, this triggered me as a musician to use it somehow. This translated in the Bellamp, a lamp which emits a long sound when switched on. It's as an ode to the light. People become more aware of using light in a world where everything sweeps by.

The Collection Cornwall

By treating materials as a paint and using them to color porcelain, I developed a color chart with 120 different colors. Twelve materials originating from the china, tin and copper industry in Cornwall were used to form the basis for this chart. The colors show the richness of the landscape in which they were once flourishing industries. In order to turn them into ceramic paint, the materials have been dried and ground, diluted with water and applied as a color coating to porcelain. This first collection consists out of a serie of objects, a book and color samples.

Colored Bowls

These bowls, made out of porcelain, are the result of a half year experimenting with oxides and porcelain clay. This research is based on copper-, nickel-, chromium-, manganese-, and cobaltoxide and how they react with porcelain clay. One set consist out of 5 bowls, nestling in each other. Some materials having a big influence on each other, the shape is transformed and colors are blending. After experimenting with the oxides, we developed a 2nd Edition in which we used green and blue tones.

MOD Round Rug

A round rug inspired by the Berber and Boucherouite style carpets with knotted and heavy wool feel. Playing with different heights, loops and color fades. Produced by ICE in a factory in Nepal, using 100% wool and the craftsmanship from traditional hand knotting.

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MOD Blanket

A blanket made out of merino and mohair wool. Minimalistic line play with subtle color fades and check patterns. Developed at the TextileLab.
